INTRODUCTION

First and foremost on behalf of AFCM Board here in Malawi, I want to express our profound gratitude to God Almighty for His grace and love we keep experiencing as an organization, to our Chairperson Pst. Oluseyi Olusile, AFCM UK Board and to our sponsors for their leadership and generosity which immensely contributed to the success of our undertaking. Not forgetting NGORA for the regulatory role which keeps giving leverage to us, as we serve the people of Malawi through humanitarian projects. Our 2025 Annual Report highlights the activities undertaken by AFCM in the year under review - 2025.

The year 2025 was both a challenging year and also a great one for AFCM Malawi. The major challenge came with the devaluation of the local currency which resulted into all our planned budgets shooting up. We had to source extra funds for us to have managed in meeting our projects target.

As an organization, during the year under review, we undertook a variety of missions which included the completion and handing over of the water project in Mbwatalika Village to the people of Mbwatalika, fertilizer distribution project in Santhe Village, the feeding of about 200 households in Chilinde - where we distributed mealie mill, Girl child empowerment by handing them sanitary pads, as an organization we were privileged to sponsor 12 Youths in Skills training at Don Bosco Institute, livestock empowerment by donating 106 goats to the people of Longwe Village.

Apart from the humanitarian projects, we preached the gospel of Jesus Christ in all the villages we visited leading many to Christ. This has resulted into a major transformation to the subjects within the villages. Crime rate reduction and increase in productivity.

COUNTRY COORDINATOR'S MESSAGE

I trust this report finds you well. Our Annual Report for the year 2025 presents our programs in reaching the most vulnerable and underserved people in Malawi.

As we look back on the past year, we are grateful for strides made in helping to build God's kingdom through humanitarian service. Our programs have helped countless people by offering critical services and support to individuals in need.

Our fertilizer distribution for farmers at Santhe Village has helped them increase their crop production, providing for better food security and awareness.

The water project in Mbwatalika Chief Chimba's Village was commissioned - Giving access to clean water, improved health and sanitation in Mbwatalika Village and it's surrounding Villages.

We have also given vulnerable girls and young women sanitary pads, enabling them to keep attending school and continue pursuing their dreams.

As an organization, in December we managed to distribute food hampers that were enough to ease more than 600 families and enable them to get their basic demands.

The distribution of 106 goats to households in Longwe Village to mention a few, gives us strength to desire to do more by God's grace

Allow me to take this opportunity to offer special thanks to our partners, stakeholders, volunteers and staff for their commitment and good work. I would like to appreciate your support and look forward to working together.

PROGRAMMES & ACTIVITIES

1.1 Farming Inputs Empowerment Initiative - Santhe Village

- The Organisation managed to distribute a total of 200 bags of fertilizer to 100 households of Santhe Village. This was in supporting their water-fed agricultural activities following the poor harvest the Village had due to poor rains. This distribution has seen them have a bumper harvest this season
- As a result, the empowerment increased crop yields, improving food security and enhanced livelihoods within Santhe Village.

1.2 Water Project Commissioning and Hand over - Mbwatalika Village

- In the year under review, we managed to complete the water project we undertook in Mbwatalika, commissioned it and had it handed over to the community under Chief Chimba.
- Impact: Access to clean water, improved health for the community of Mbwatalika and good sanitation.

1.3 Livestock Empowerment Project - Longwe Village

- We managed to distribute 106 goats in Longwe Village where we had 106 families receiving livestock empowerment
- Impact: This has resulted into improved livestock management, which with time will mean improved income and food security for the people of Longwe Village.

1.4 Sanitary Pads Distribution - Chilinde Community and Bread of Life Church Int'l

- The distribution of reusable sanitary pads to the vulnerable school going girls and women in Mbwatalika, Chilinde Community and Bread of Life Church Int'l has greatly helped and brought dignity to a girl child.
- Impact: Improved menstrual hygiene, reduced dropout rate in school attendance and increased confidence.

1.5 Food Hampers Distribution (Mealie Mill, Cooking Oil and Sugar) - Chilinde Community

- We managed to distribute food hampers to over 450 households in Chilinde Community and 20 households within Bread of Life Church Int'l.
- Impact: Food security and improved well being of the vulnerable within our communities and Church.

ACHIEVEMENTS

- 1.6 As an Organisation we managed in record time to do the Water Project in Mbwatalika Village despite of the devaluation of the Kwacha. We were able to hand over the facility to the people of Mbwatalika Village
- 1.7 As we promised the people of Santhe village, we managed to donate 200 bags of fertilizer to 100 households
- 1.8 Sponsorship of 12 Youths in Skills training at Don Bosco Institute. We were able to have trained - 8 Youths in Tailoring & design, 3 in Plumbing and 1 in Welding.
- 1.9 In all the villages and places we have been to, we preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and witness the transformation of many lives to God's glory
- 1.10 The donation of 106 goats to the people of Longwe Village

The summary of key achievements in 2025 includes:

- Many households in 2025 compared to the year before, having benefitted from our humanitarian works
- Success stories and testimonies - for example in Longwe Village, the Chiefs testified that crime rate has gone down. With the livestock empowerment, the Village has become more productive than before.
- Lessons learned and best practices: Wherever we have gone as an Organisation, we have learnt to work with both traditional leaders and Church leaders as well. We feel the best practice is to take development and empowerment to villages through their leaders. Where there is need for capacity empowerment, we do offer trainings to local leaders and Church leaders.

Revenue

Foreign currency received: The organization had a total of £10,000 in foreign currency, some of which was converted into the local currency (MK). This was used to facilitate some 2025 projects undertaken

Grants in kind received: No grant was received from any public body, neither in the UK nor in Malawi, and no such application was made.

Other income: There was no other income received. The above £10,000 was a donation from the UK from a couple who collaborated with the organization for us to deliver on the projects in 2025, especially the water project at Mbwatalika.

Other source of income: This has come directly from the Chair's own business ventures in the UK.

Expenditure

Total salaries and Wages: The organization is not operated with staff on paid salary. All board members and workers all operate on a voluntary basis. There is the occasional cash gifts given to board members as and when the Chair visits the country. Monies paid out to youth volunteers are refunds towards their expenses such as fuel, refreshments when on errands.

Other operating costs: All our expenditure goes towards the purchase of items for projects, and other logistics associated with carrying out those projects. These expenditures are known as operating costs.
